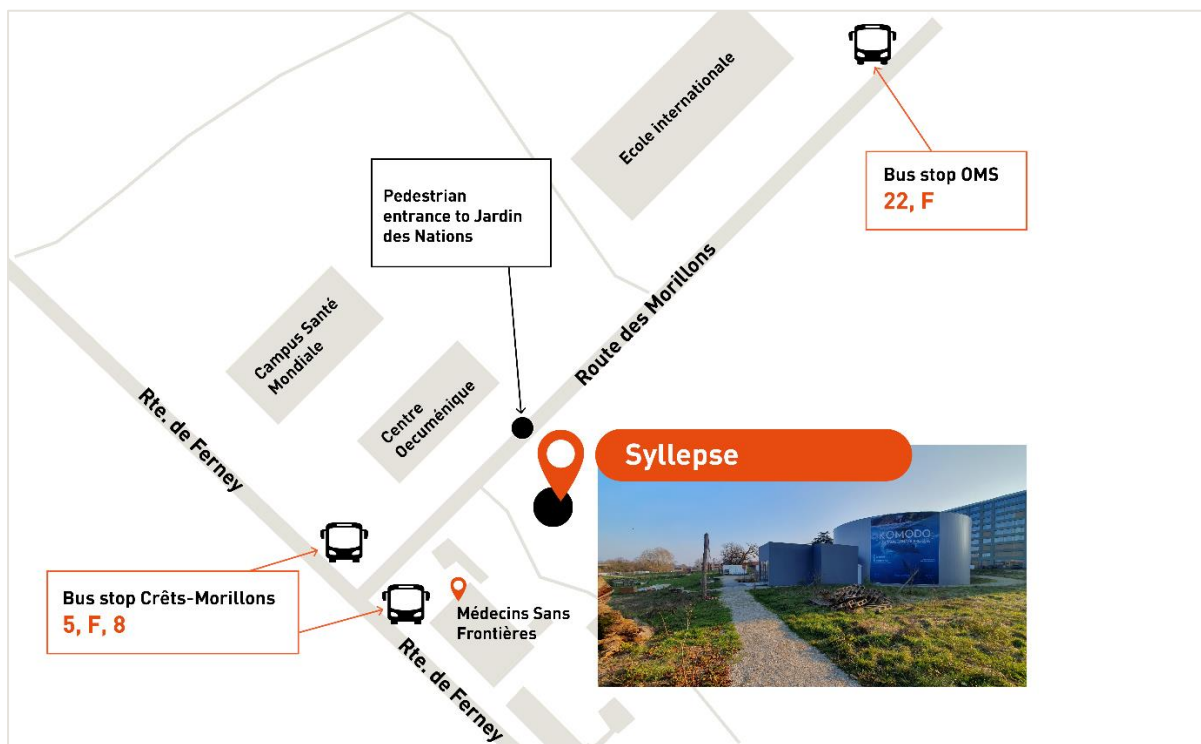
Important

On foot from Pregny Gate: The Jardin des Nations is a 12-minute walk away from the Pregny Gate of the UNOG opposite the International Committee of the Red Cross.

By bus: You can take Bus F or 22 and stop at OMS to get there. Alternatively, you can take Bus 5 or 8 from the Place des Nations and stop at Crêts-de-Morillon.

Shuttle service: A shuttle service will be provided to bring World Health Assembly attendees from the Palais des Nations to the Syllepse. **Shuttle buses labelled “DNDi” will leave opposite the Pregny gate between 17:30 and 17:45.** Note that shuttle service will not be provided after the event, but there are bus stops conveniently located just outside the venue for buses going to the airport, the UN Palais, and downtown.
